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I worked in recruitment for four and half years, but I always knew I wanted to work in Human Resources (HR). I found trying to transition into a HR role quite difficult as many employers couldn't see my transferrable skills - the feedback was always the same, that 'I didn't have the relevant in-house experience', common feedback for anyone looking to change direction in their career! However, I knew this was something I wanted to pursue and so I decided to step away from recruitment to focus on achieving a HR qualification
