She even carried out recruitment processes as the business pivoted towards needs brought about by Coronavirus restrictions.

Having completed her Apprenticeship in December 2020, Charlotte is now thrilled to be a full-time HR Administrator supporting the team.

"I do have a lot of responsibility, especially in the current climate, and a completely different life from my friends who stayed at school and went on to university," Charlotte says.
