The Course

In brief...

The aim of this qualification is to provide learners with an in-depth knowledge and understanding of babies and young children from birth to 7 years of age, with applied knowledge in the early years, 0 - 5 years. The qualification content meets the Department for Education's (DfE) Level 3 'full and relevant' criteria for a Level 3 Early Years Practitioner. Upon successful completion of this qualification learners can enter the workforce as a qualified Level 3 Early Years Practitioner.

This qualification allows learners to count towards the Level 3 ratio as a qualified Level 3 Early Years Practitioner across the Early Years Workforce

Learners may be employed in a variety of roles such as:

- Senior Nursery Practitioner/Manager (when experience has been gained)
- Classroom Assistant
- Pre-school Deputy/Room Leader/Manager

On successful completion of the Level 3 EYE Diploma, there may be the opportunity to progress onto the Fda Early Years Services (University of Wolverhampton) Degree course and then onto the (BA Hons) Early Childhood Studies (Top-Up) at college - please see the college website for further details.

What do I need to apply

To do this course you should have...

Apprentices must be working for approximately 30 hours per week in an appropriate early years setting. It is a requirement that a Level 2 Maths and English qualification is achieved prior to starting the Level 3 course in order to ensure the full apprenticeship is achieved and to meet sector requirements.
