

The Course

In brief...

English as a Foreign Language (EFL) x 15 hrs a week is designed to help you improve your overall English language level and develop skills in speaking, listening, reading and writing. The course will help you improve your knowledge and understanding of English grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation, for personal, professional or academic use.

Students taking our English programme will be offered help and practice in how to study.

Our General English Language programme is aimed at:

- those preparing to take English Language qualifications, e.g. IELTS;
- those aiming to reach the required level of English to continue studying at The College, or at a UK University.
- · those looking to improve their ability to communicate in English

Our courses include:

- elementary through to advanced levels (subject to numbers)
- an average of 18 mixed nationality students per class
- highly qualified level teachers
- membership of Student Union, who plan college wide societies and activities
- free unlimited use of the internet and email during College opening hours
- access to high quality learner facilities including study support, a library and sport centre.
- a beautiful seaside location in Bournemouth

Course Content

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General English classes cover reading, writing, speaking (including pronunciation) and listening. They are based on a course book, but teachers will often add materials from other sources depending on their student's needs and interests. For example, they may bring in newspaper articles, use pronunciation websites or other online resources, or use news items from British television.

In addition to the content specific to every level, the course also includes:

- study skills that will help you continue to learn outside the classroom
- pronunciation skills, which will help you understand the sounds you are reading and allow you to say new words in the correct way
- lessons about British culture
- exam skills
- work-related topics (for example, understanding job adverts) and skills (CV writing, presentation skills, interpersonal skills)
- oral presentation skills which will help in future jobs and if you go on to study at university

In your lessons you will be asked to be active and participate in a variety of activities (e.g. grammar exercises, pair and group work, communication, self and peer correction, oral presentations and exam preparation). It is important that you ask questions when you do not understand an idea that is brought up in class. You will also be able to give feedback on your classes and tell us if you want additional topics or activities.
