


• Look around your house at different times of day to find pools of Light that you can use to light your subject.






- Use Gregory Crewsdons photographs to inspire 4 photographs.
- Attempt to use mixed lighting; that is daylight and light from a light bulb, lamp shade or desk top lamp as these are often a warmer light Than daylight and give you different hues of light.

• Think about the story you are creating; what has just happened or What is about to happen? You may want to have more than one

person in these photographs.



Look at all the photographs and answer the following questions:

Which photo is most affective at conveying a narrative?

Which photo has the most unusual lighting?

Which photo is your favourite?

Which photo reflects the them of 'Youth' the best?

Show the photos to at least 2 other people and ask the same questions. Use the answers to these questions to help you to choose the best photograph to enter into the Dorset Arts Prize.
